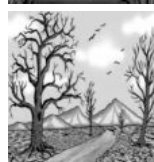

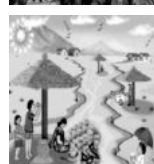

(a) Solar energy : Solar energy provides power without producing green house gases for our home or business. It is completely renewable source of energy. Electricity from solar plants supplies commercial - grade power, reducing dependence on coal and natural gas. It reduces expenses due to electricity.

(b) Wind energy : Wind energy is also used to generate electricity. The principle of wind turbine is to tap wind flowing energy to rotate the propellers which rotates the turbines to produce electricity. The electricity is used to run electric devices and or stored in the batteries.

(c) Hydro energy : A primary use of hydro power energy is to produce electricity. It is energy collected from flowing water that's converted into electricity or used to power machinery. Centuries ago it was used to turn mill wheels or drive early industrial machinery, best in modern use it typically refers to electrical generation.
